On grinding Black Opal, at Lightning Ridge, the rule of thumb is; if there's color follow it. If it's flat then grind flat with whatever potch is on the back.

Example:

POTCH POTCH

Color is .010 - .030 thick with a thin backing.

On lots of color and ample potch the stone can look like this:




Odd shapes and sizes. From the side, like this:
